- 1938- FOLDER 6 (DEC. 2): Illini coaches arranging schedules; Zuppke honors and cooperates with Athletic Board; Wilson prepares to call athletic board meeting; Russell and Wilson to keep present posts; Zuppke at peace with Wilson; and the law students' petition gains signatures.
- 1938- FOLDER 7 (DEC. 3-31): Zuppke's speech at the LaSalle-Peru Township High School; Board of Trustees placed University's interests first; students want representation in Athletic Board; the ten hour Board of Trustees meeting; sources claim Zuppke initiated retirement move; Wilson's opposition to a student trustee on the Athletic Board; and President Willard meets with Athletic Directors.
- 1939- Zuppke's old West Division High School; McLean County Illini Club claims firing Zuppke not a solution; an ad for Grange's book (*Zuppke of Illinois*); Zuppke's victory over the Athletic Association; Zuppke's refusal to buy football players; the *Commercial Appeals's* Mayors' luncheon; Illinois victory over Michigan silences Zuppke's critics; Zuppke in favor again; and Zuppke resigns after 29 years as head football coach at Illinois.
- 1940- Zuppke's retirement; homages to Zuppke; Zuppke exhibits his paintings in Chicago at the Palmer House; Zuppke's Michigan vacation; and Zuppke plays in Waukegan golf tournament.
- 1941- FOLDER 1: Zuppke as Chanute Field Art Exhibit Judge; Grange as the greatest back; Illinois' victory over Miami; coverage of the Minnesota-Illini game; speculation over the new Illini head coach; and Zuppke's official resignation after 29 years as head coach.
