1. William C. Wierman, Putnam County. Ill., to IP, Apr. 12, 1840 (using an Elijah Lovejoy letterhead)
2. Amy Wierman to IP, Apr. 12, 1840 (attached to letter 1)
3. William C. Wierman, Putnam County, Ill., to IP, Apr. 19, 1841
4. Charles M. Aten, New Lisbon, Ohio, to H. Wierman, Apr. 29, 1842 (attorney's letter regarding litigation)
5. William C. Wierman, Putnam County, Ill., to IP, Mar. 18, 1845
6. Charlotte Pearson, Putnam County, Ill., to IP, Oct. 26 and 30, 1845 (newcomer's reaction to Illinois landscape and politics)
7. Susan [Wierman], Magnolia, Ill., to IP, Aug. 6 and 7, 1848 (partisan Liberty Party letter, attacks Zachary Taylor and his supporters)
8. C[harlotte] Pearson, Magnolia, Ill., to IP, Sept, 11, 1856 (discusses changes in Illinois since 1845)
