Dear Sister

I received your letter
March 23 and was glad to ear
that you was all well Sister
you must pleas to excuse my
neglect in not answering
Brother John letter for I
was very poorly my poor
Jane died the 5 of August
and the death of our Dear
Father was a double grief to
us poor Jane Deases was
the bronchitis she was 11 years
of age she was quite sensible
to the last she kept her head but
3 days

Dear Sister you wanted to know if we had a sever winter we have had two very sever winters and last summer was a very weat summer and there is a deal of unsound bread we give half a crown a stone for flour and fat pigs are seling at eleven shillings per score Dear Sister you said if you came won or two must go back with you Lesey said that she will go back with you but I said not like you to com your self I shud like some won to com with you I often wish I cud but see you for I have a deal to tel you more then I can writ

pleas to tell John I will writ to him soon tho I have been so long I have not forgot him my neglect is not for want of thort for I often think of you all give our love to John and Susan pleas to give our love to Joseph and Mary and Dear Sister the Money that my Dear Father left me must be given to Mary I feel obliged to them that they have not troubled us for their share I hope we shall pay them all I dont know when they will get a letter from William for he is so backward in writing to any body
