Of Colored Glass: Luxury, Loss, and Imitation from Antiquity to Byzantium

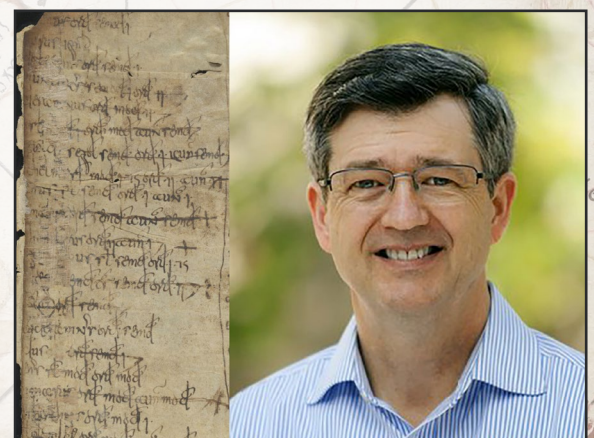
