DESCRIPTION

- A. <u>Purpose</u>: To support the instructional and research programs of the Department of Germanic Languages and Literatures involving the literature and language studies of Old Norse/Icelandic, runes, and the historical and current literatures and languages of Iceland, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and the Faeroe Islands.
- B. <u>History of Collection</u>: In the early 20th century, Scandinavian studies were taught in the English Department. The collections were built up significantly by prominent professors, notably Henning Larsen and George Flom. The George Flom Library of over 2,000 valuable items was donated in 1941, and the Henning Larsen collection was purchased in 1971. Since 1959 Scandinavian language, literature and cultural studies have been offered regularly through the Department of Germanic Languages and Literatures.
 - C. Estimate of Holdings: 23,475 volumes.
- D. <u>State. Regional. and National Importance</u>: The Scandinavian collections at Illinois are considered by most scholars to be outstanding and to rank among the top ten North American libraries with collections in these areas.
- E. <u>Unit Responsible for Collecting</u>: Modern Languages and Linguistics Library.
- F. <u>Location of Materials</u>: Reference works and a small core collection are held in Modern Languages and Linguistics Library. The majority of materials are in the Bookstacks, but many are in the Reference Room, the Rare Book and Special Collections Library, and the Undergraduate Library.

II. GENERAL COLLECTION GUIDELINES

- A. <u>Languages</u>: Primarily Old Norse/Icelandic, Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, and English, with selective acquisition of translations of primary source materials as well as secondary criticism in other Western European languages. Only selected items are acquired in Modern Icelandic and Faeroese.
 - B. <u>Chronological Guidelines</u>: No restrictions.
- C. <u>Geographical Guidelines</u>: Iceland, Finland (Swedish language publications), Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Faeroe Islands.

- D. <u>Treatment of Subject</u>: Standard statement. Materials have subject focus on some aspect of the Scandinavian languages and literatures. In addition, juvenile literature is acquired very selectively; however, it is given greater emphasis when the authors are important literary figures.
 - E. Types of Materials: Standard statement.
 - F. Date of Publication: Standard statement.
 - G. Place of Publication: No restrictions.
